an interdisciplinary collective analysis of the cultural, social, political and economical relevance of documenta 14 (Athens, Kassel) and the 57th Venice Biennale (Venice)

CONTEMPORARY ART IN THE GLOBAL PRESENT is an interdisciplinary, itinerant summer school addressing the cultural, social, political and economical relevance of international recurrent exhibitions with a focus on documenta 14 and the 57th Esposizione Internazionale d'Arte - La Biennale di Venezia (Venice Biennale).

Recurrent large-scale exhibitions of contemporary art such as the Venice Biennale and the documenta are recognizable as rhizomatic structures with implications on multiple cultural, social, political as well as economical domains and scales. Historically, these two exhibition formats are bound to two different and yet complementary approaches to contemporary art. One of the main aims of the Venice Biennale is to capture *the state* of contemporary art while the long five-year interval of the documenta allows one to imagine answers to the ontological question: what *is* (contemporary) art? The Greek debt and economic crisis has drawn international attention to the symptoms of a wider European and global crisis - not just a financial crisis but above all, a crisis of values with profound humanitarian, institutional, political and media implications. These challenges are addressed by both exhibitions. This is why documenta 14 takes place not only in Kassel, but also in Athens under the title: *Learning from Athens* and the 57th Venice Biennale - *VIVA ARTE VIVA* - invests on the progressive power of contemporary art promising to open a possibility for a *neoumanesimo*.

CONTEMPORARY ART IN THE GLOBAL PRESENT invites 18 international students and researches from all disciplines (advanced M. A. students, doctoral students and candidates, postdoc researchers) to engage in a 12 day summer school entirely dedicated to the analysis of the cultural, social, political, and economical relevance of these two large-scale recurrent exhibitions and their respective organizing institutions.

At the centre of *CONTEMPORARY ART IN THE GLOBAL PRESENT* are the documenta 14 and the 57<sup>th</sup> Venice Biennale in Venice, Athens and Kassel. Three days are dedicated to each exhibition and spent in the respective cities. The key terms of the exhibited works as well as the meanings that arise from their constellations will be analysed. This analysis is carried out in a participatory and collegial manner throughout the whole of the summer school, so that the applicants can benefit from the added value of the collective visits to the exhibitions and the places where they take place. Dialogues with curators, educators, and academics working for the respective exhibitions in the respective cities are planned. They are organized in the form of lectures and workshops in which the participants to the summer school are invited to work in small groups.

CONTEMPORARY ART IN THE GLOBAL PRESENT will end in Cologne where the participants are invited to reflect on and organize the knowledge gained during the summer school and publicly present the first results of the itinerant research experience.

A day trip to the 4th edition of Skulptur Projekte in Münster is planned.

### Elegibility:

Advanced M.A. students, doctoral students and candidates, postdoc researchers from all disciplines.

#### Language skills:

CONTEMPORARY ART IN THE GLOBAL PRESENT will be primary held in English; passive knowledge of other European languages such as German, Italian and Greek is a plus.
